There are currently 82,170 children in the care system, with many experiencing barriers to education: 45% have a mental health disorder, 56% have special educational needs and 12% have been excluded from school.

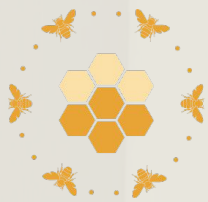


Equal Education work to overcome these barriers by offering specialist tutoring programmes to provide academic support from qualified teachers to narrow the attainment gap.

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Vision

Equal Education was founded in 2012 by Paul Singh and Kim Rihal.

Their vision is a society where no young person is disadvantaged, sidelined or disempowered by the **circumstances of their upbringing**. Instead, they want to see vulnerable children accessing the **same opportunity** and carrying the same aspiration as everyone else, so that they can **fulfil their potential and enrich and advance our world**.

 - Student approval rating of **94%** and many reporting **increased confidence** resulting in successful reintegration into school and improved attainment.
